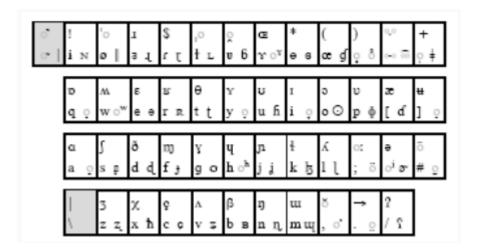

## Special characters and NetExplorer

For the sake of standardization,	between operating systems,	we adopted rules based	on Windows rules.

Here are a few rules to follow:		

→ In file names, banish :
<ul> <li>characters \ /:*?" &lt; &gt;  </li> <li>spaces and tabulations in the end of file name or at beginning.</li> </ul>
ightarrow Out of these specific cases, NetExplorer accepts $$ all of the other specific characters of the
following languages :
French
English
Chinese
Russian
Spanish



## Notes

• If you have a lot of files containing unaccepted characters, you should know that there are some converters available on the internet.
